BACKGROUND

Oil Shale

The McConnell-Domenici amendment would end the moratorium prohibiting commercial leasing for oil shale until the Bureau of Land Management fully analyzes the development potential and likely impacts of oil shale development. Rep. Mark Udall (D-CO) sponsored the moratorium to protect Western Colorado if a premature oil shale boom goes bust, as it did in 1982.

Sections 211 and 232 encourage the use of liquid coal. These sections would create a mandate for liquid coal and let the Department of Defense enter into 25-year contracts to buy liquid coal.

This expensive process would consume massive amounts of water and produce nearly twice the greenhouse gas emissions of conventional gasoline. Not only does the McConnell-Domenici amendment do nothing to limit greenhouse gas emissions from liquid coal, it would end the restriction on purchases of high-carbon fuels by federal agencies.
